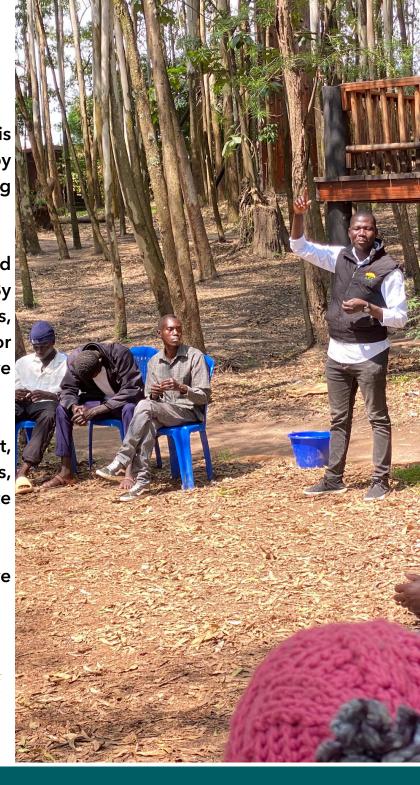

With each session, I gained confidence and clarity about my future. Play Based Resilience Education

Primary School Program

225 Students Graduated

Highlight: In the first quarter of 2025, 135 students and their families graduated from the program. 92 students and their families graduated in the second quarter.



Climbing Club Program

101 Youth Graduated

Highlight: In the first quarter of 2025, a boot camp for the youth who graduated from the program over the years was organized. 61 youth and their families were part of this meeting. 40 participants and their families graduated in the second quarter. 40 youth will graduate in the third quarter.

Here is what happens when you invest as a monthly donor:

- \$25: The family of a child awaiting trial to attends "TRP Family Day" for an afternoon of healing play
- \$50: A class of primary school students can visit The Recreation Project for a field trip
- \$100: One child and their caregiver graduate from the TRP Program
- \$150: A youth facilitator is hired to be a catalyst of change in the lives of young people
- \$200: 30 TRP program graduates attend a 3-day youth camp at the end of the year to celebrate their sustained progress
